#### **ACTION ITEM:**

2023 FRYINGPAN-ARKANSAS PROJECT WATER AND PROJECT WATER RETURN FLOW Garrett Markus presented on the current hydrology of the Fryingpan basin and the Colorado River. The import projections for Fryingpan-Arkansas Project Water (Project Water) are driven by five Snotel sites throughout the collection system; Kiln, Nast Lake, Ivanhoe, Chapman, and Independence Pass.

The May 1, official forecast was 55,400 AF from the Bureau of Reclamation. The amount available for Allocation after deductions is 42,282 AF, water available for allocation at 70 percent is 28,820 AF. The complete breakdown for each entity requesting Project Water was shown. The final recommended allocation is municipal 20,585 at 48.69 percent, NPANIW 1,518

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AF at 3.59 percent and agriculture at 20,179 AF at 47.72 percent. The Return Flow allocation totaled 7,098 AF.
